ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION FOR RETARDED, INC.

That we, the undersigned, for the purpose of forming a corporation pursuant to the General Non-Profit Corporation Law of the State of California, hereby certify:

ARTICLE I

That the name of the corporation shall be
COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION FOR RETARDED, INC.

ARTICLE II

The specific and primary purpose for which the corporation is formed is to acquire and operate a facility to be used for recreational and educational purposes for the mentally retarded.

ARTICLE III

Said corporation does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit to the members thereof, and no income shall inure to the benefit of any individual member of this corporation and, in addition to the purposes set forth in Article II, the purposes for which it is formed are as follows:

a) To develop a program of education and training that will promote self-sufficiency in the mentally handicapped and retarded, to provide them with an opportunity to live a useful and beneficial life;

b) To communicate and cooperate with other organizations having as their objective the improvement of the status of the mentally retarded and handicapped;

c) To provide opportunities for the mentally retarded and handicapped to engage in outdoor activities, such as camping and similar programs;

d) To hire, lease, buy, or otherwise acquire, and to rent, lease, mortgage or sell land, buildings, and equipment for camp sites, club houses, headquarters, buildings, or other uses incidental to said purposes; and to build, construct, operate and manage the same for the benefit of the mentally retarded and handicapped;

e) To engage in and to do any and all other things which a non-profit corporation may lawfully do.

ARTICLE IV

The county where the principal office for the transaction of the business of the corporation is to be located is: Santa Clara.

ARTICLE V

Article VI

a) The number, qualifications and classes of members, the property, voting and other rights and privileges of each class of membership, and the liability of each and all classes as to dues or assessments and the method of collection thereof shall be set forth in the by-laws of the corporation.

b) That the number of persons named above in paragraph V shall constitute the number of Directors of this corporation until changed by an amendment to the by-laws increasing or decreasing the number thereof, and the number shall never be less than eleven (11).

Article VII

The corporation shall not engage in carrying on of progaganda or otherwise either advocating or opposing pending or proposed legislation. The corporation shall further not participate in or intervene in any political campaign

on behalf of any candidate for public office, and shall not distribute or publish statements with respect to political campaigns.

ARTICLE VIII

In event of the liquidation or dissolution of the corporation, its assets shall be distributed to another charitable organization generally formed for and engaging in purposes similar to the purposes for which this corporation is formed, and which has qualified for exemption under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), or such other legislation of similar import as shall be in effect at the time of such dissolution.

ARTICLE IX

The by-laws of this corporation shall be adopted by the Directors named in the Articles of Incorporation, and may thereafter be amended or repealed by any means provided in the by-laws.

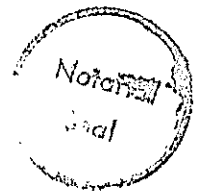

That we, the undersigned, for the purpose of forming a corporation pursuant to the General Non-Profit Corporation Law of the State of California, hereby certify:

ARTICLE I

That the name of the corporation shall be COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION FOR RETARDED, INC.

ARTICLE II

The specific and primary purpose for which the corporation is formed is to acquire and operate all kinds of facilities to be used for the developmental and rehabilitative needs of the mentally retarded and other developmentally disabled persons of all ages. Other handicapped persons may be served when appropriate.

ARTICLE III

Said corporation does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit to the members thereof, and no income shall inure to the benefit of any individual member of this corporation and, in addition to the purposes set forth in Article II, the purposes for which it is formed are as follows:

- a) To develop and operate all kinds of programs for the development and rehabilitation of the mentally retarded, other developmentally disabled and other handicapped persons as appropriate. To serve persons of all ages to the end of promoting their self-sufficiency and providing them with an opportunity to live as useful and beneficial lives as possible;

including, without limitation: education, therapies, vocational training, recreational programs, swimming, social and personal adjustment and development, and group living experiences in small residential homes providing board, care, supervised living and training.

- b) To communicate, cooperate and coordinate efforts with other organizations having as their objectives the improvement of the status of the developmentally disabled and other handicapped individuals.
